FAQ Regarding Northridge Middle School

How early can I drop my student off at school?

The doors to Northridge are unlocked at 7:30 a.m. Students are not allowed in the building until then, unless there is a pre-arranged activity or pre-approval from administration.

Where does my student go if he/she arrives at school before 7:50 a.m.?

All students should wait in the front lobby if they arrive before 7:50 a.m. When the clock in the front lobby changes to 7:50 a.m., students are allowed to proceed to their lockers.

How long are the passing periods?

Passing periods are 5 minutes long at Northridge. Considering the size of our building, that is plenty of time for your student to go to their locker and then to their next class. There is a 1 minute warning bell to make students aware of how much time they have left before their next class begins. Please see the Student Handbook for further information.

What classes will my student take in the 6th grade?

Your student will take the following classes during his/her 6th grade year at NRMS:

English/Language Arts - 3 trimesters

Math - 3 trimesters

Science - 2 trimesters

Social Studies - 2 trimesters

Wellness (PE) - 1 trimester

S.M.A.R.T. - 1 trimester

Students also take one exploratory class per trimester. Students can take the Exploratory Rotation (**Business Tech, Family and Consumer Science, Art**) or they take **Band or Choir**.

Band and Choir

Students are permitted to take Band or Choir. As 6th graders, they may be in one of these courses for all three trimesters.

I see S.M.A.R.T Class on my student's schedule--What is it?

S.M.A.R.T. is an acronym that stands for **S**ixth Graders **M**aximizing **A**ttitudes and **A**ilities (with) **R**esponsibility (via) **T**echnology. Your student will take this course one trimester only. The course content will include but is not limited to: Intro to Careers, Study Skills, Note Taking, Organization, Time Management, Research Skills, Listening Skills, Learning Styles, Conflict Resolution, etc. We hope students will come away from this course better prepared to handle the demands of middle school.

I see Reading and/or Learning Lab on my student's schedule--What is it?

Reading and Learning Lab is another exploratory class that some students will take to improve specific reading or math skills. Students may be placed in this class anywhere from one to three trimesters.

How do I read my student's schedule?

Here are a few basic guidelines:

What is Bonus?

Bonus occurs as the last period of the school day on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday from 3:00-3:40 p.m. with bus transportation provided. However, your student may also voluntarily stay after for bonus in order to participate in a club or other extracurricular activity. No sports practice will begin until after bonus, which is on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday.

Are schedule changes allowed during the school year?

Schedule changes are only allowed in special circumstances. Below is a list of circumstances that are not considered special circumstances:

- I don't want that teacher.
- I don't have any friends in my class.
- I would rather eat lunch earlier in the day.
- I don't want P.E. first thing in the morning.

If you must request a schedule change, then it needs to be requested before the trimester begins.

Will my student have a lot of homework in the 6th Grade?

You may not see much homework coming home during 6th grade. We have 5 periods a day, so each period is 55-60 minutes long. The 6th grade teachers design their instruction to allow for time for assignments to be started and/or completed in the classroom. Students can also stay for Bonus in order to get homework completed.

When will my student get the Northridge Student Handbook?

Your student's Northridge Handbook will be electronically distributed a few days after receiving their 1:1 device. Please make sure you and your student read through the Student Handbook that will be included on the device. Students will not receive a hard copy of the Student Handbook however will be required to sign the Student Handbook form stating they received and reviewed the procedures of Northridge Middle School. This form will be on file in the main office.

When will my student eat lunch?

Your student will be scheduled to eat lunch during his/her 3rd Period class. The 3rd period teacher will tell your child what lunch he/she will be assigned on the first day of school.

The lunch schedule is as follows:

- 11:15-11:45 -A LUNCH
- 11:50- 12:20 -B LUNCH
- 12:20-12:50 -C LUNCH

How does the cafe work?

Students are required to keep money in their lunch account. If they run out of money, they will have to eat peanut butter and jelly until the account is paid. Students do not have assigned seating in the café and are allowed to use their 1:1 devices and/or cell phones (just no phone calls).

Will my student have his/her own locker at Northridge?

Yes. Students are assigned their own locker at Northridge. They are not allowed to share lockers during the year. Also, it is important to remember not to share locker combinations with anyone. FYI: Many students enjoy decorating their lockers. Please don't use tape, glue, or stickers of any kind. Magnets are a student's best option.

Where and when will my student get textbooks/1:1 devices?

Textbooks and devices will be passed out by the teachers within the first week of school. Textbook invoices will be mailed out August 24, 2018 and will be due back September 19, 2018.

What school supplies are needed?

Supply lists are available online at the Northridge Middle School Website.

Are there Wellness (PE) uniforms?

Yes. Students are expected to participate in PE in the designated Northridge PE uniform. Uniforms are sold at Top Line in Crawfordsville.

What is the dress code?

Northridge dress code is outlined specifically in the Student Handbook your student will receive electronically during the first few days of school. However, a brief description follows:

- Shorts and skirts must reach below a student's extended fingertips.
- Shirts should have a sleeve, and must be able to be tucked in.
- Clothes should not have a lot of rips or tears.
- All pants, jeans, or shorts must fit at the waist and cannot "sag."
- Clothing that advertises alcoholic beverages, illegal drugs, and that has vulgar or suggestive wording is not permitted.
- Hats and bandanas are not to be worn at any time inside the building during the regular school day.

What happens if my student's clothing does not meet the dress code?

If your student is not dressed appropriately, he/she will be given the opportunity to change into something more appropriate. We may have to contact you if your student does not have anything at school and does not want to wear what we offer them; however our school nurse has extra clothes in the clinic.

Can my student bring personal electronic devices (smart phones, iPods, etc.) to school?

Students may bring personal computing devices to school **for educational purposes only** such as research, writing, and other educational purposes with individual teacher permission, however all Northridge students will be issued a 1:1 school device resulting in students not needing their personal devices.

What if my student gets sick during the school day?

Students must see the school nurse if they get sick during the school day. The nurse calls parents if a student needs to go home.

What if my student needs to use the phone? Can he/she just use a cell phone?

Use of personal cell/smart phone within the classroom is a disruption to the learning environment and **will not** be permitted. Students may go to the office to make personal phone calls. It is advised parents do not call students' cell phones during the school day. You may call the front office as Mrs. Randall will always find your child to give them a message.

My student wants to ride the bus home with a friend after school. What is the procedure in this situation?

A note from a parent/guardian is needed. Students are not allowed to board a bus that is not their own without a bus pass. Mrs. Randall, the receptionist at the front desk in the office, issues all bus passes. Notes/phone calls from parents giving permission must go through Mrs. Randall and must be in before noon on any given day.

Are there school dances?

Yes, school dances occur throughout the school year and are sponsored by either the Northridge Student Council or the Northridge National Junior Honor Society.

Are there any clubs, activities, or sports?

YES! Here is a list of activities open to 6th graders (including but not limited to):

Football, Basketball, Track, Golf, Tennis, Cheerleading, Student Council, Cross Country, Soccer, Volleyball, Art Club, FACS Club, Robotic Club, FCS, Yearbook Club, etc.

What should I tell my student to do if the locker gets stuck, they forget the combination, or their class schedule?

Encourage your student to go to a teacher or the office for help. Please go over with them how important it is for them to not give out their locker combination to anyone. Students are not allowed to share lockers with other people. All students have been assigned their own locker and need to use the one assigned to them.

How does my student get involved in sports/clubs?

Announcements are read at the beginning of every school day. It is during this time that students will get information regarding sports try-outs and club meetings. Information will also be provided on the school website. You may also call the front office for any questions regarding sports or clubs. Call outs and sign-ups also take place during the three lunch periods.

***Please note:** Students must have a physical and a drug form on file at Northridge before they can participate in any sports activities or other extra-curricular activities.

An older student I know told me the 8th graders stuff the 6th graders into lockers. Is that true?

NO! Although there are 8th graders in the building, they are hardly ever in the same hallway with the 6th graders. They are worried about getting to class on time, just like your student will be. However, just so you know, our hallways are monitored at all times by staff members and security cameras.

What if someone picks on my student?

The best thing you can encourage your child to do is to walk away from the situation. If the situation is more than he/she can handle, report the situation to a staff member (counselor, teacher, principal, etc.). We will take care of the situation and make sure your student is well taken care of. Please encourage your child to come to us; we cannot take care of a situation we know nothing about.
