

FAQ Regarding North Montgomery Middle School

How early can I drop my student off at school?

The doors to NMMS are unlocked at 7:30 a.m. Students are not allowed in the building until then, unless there is a pre-arranged activity or pre-approval from administration.

Where does my student go if he/she arrives at school before 7:55 a.m.?

All students should wait in the gymnasium if they arrive before 7:55 a.m. When the bell chimes at 7:55 a.m., students are allowed to proceed to their lockers.

How long are the passing periods?

*At this time, there will be no lockers for the beginning of the school year.

Passing periods are 5 minutes long. Considering the size of our building, there is plenty of time for your student to go to their locker and then to their next class. There is a 1 minute warning bell to make students aware of how much time they have left before their next class begins. Please see the Student Handbook for further information.

What classes will my student take in the 6th grade?

Your student will take the following classes during his/her 6th grade year at NRMS:

English/Language Arts - 3 trimesters

Math - 3 trimesters

Science - 2 trimesters

Social Studies - 2 trimesters

Wellness (PE) - 1 trimester

What are the exploratory classes offered at NMMS?

ELECTIVE COURSE INFORMATION -

BE FIT-Mr. McClamroch-1 trimester class- BeFit is a new class offered to NMMS students in the 6th and 7th grade. Students will be able to increase their personal physical fitness through a variety of strength training and exercise programs. Students will learn how important it is for them to understand how their bodies move and can improve. The 3 goals for this class are that students will increase their physical fitness through appropriate strength training and exercise. Second, students will grow in understanding of why correct physical activity is so important for the future of our community. Third, students will increase their academic scores through understanding the relationship between neuroscience and exercise.

DIGITAL LEARNING-Mr. Greene- 1 trimester class- This course will help students learn different Google applications. Students will apply these digital skills to real-life projects. Included in the projects are a stock market simulation, planning an event, and creating a calendar.

FACS (Family and Consumer Science)- Ms. McCord - 1 trimester class- Students learn how to become independent by demonstrating skills needed to care for personal and family resources. Students analyze factors that contribute to positive relationships with peers and family. Students research future careers and learn about resource management.

ART- Mr. Granger- 1 trimester class- This art course is a one trimester elective that will practice new art techniques and right brain skills. The student will be introduced to media that are utilized in the other art electives including: drawing, painting, ceramics, sculpture, printing, and fiber arts. Students will focus on the elements and principles of design, color theory, and the critical process. Practicing fine motor skills will be a strong focus.

MUSICAL THEATER- Mrs. Birk - 1 trimester class - This class we will look at many aspects of the Music Theater World. This will be an interactive, hands on class where students explore the physical side of Music Theater like acting, dancing, auditioning, etc. but will also include elements of the way this genre became what it is today. We will look at the history of musicals, analyzing/comparing/contrasting current and past musicals, and all things creative about this topic.

BAND- Mr. Simpkins- Band is a 3 trimester class. If you choose Band, you will get one additional elective course in your schedule.

CHOIR- Mrs. Birk- Choir is a 3 trimester class. If you choose Choir, you will get one additional elective course in your schedule. Choir will be capped at 55 students.

How do I read my student's schedule?

What is Bonus?

**At this time, Bonus has been suspended for the time being.

Bonus occurs as the last period of the school day on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday from 3:00-3:40 p.m. with bus transportation provided. However, your student may also voluntarily

stay after for bonus in order to participate in a club or other extracurricular activity. No sports practice will begin until after bonus, which is on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday.

Are schedule changes allowed during the school year?

Schedule changes are only allowed in special circumstances. Below is a list of circumstances that are not considered special circumstances:

- I don't want that teacher.
- I don't have any friends in my class.
- I would rather eat lunch earlier in the day.
- I don't want P.E. first thing in the morning.

If you must request a schedule change, then it needs to be requested before the trimester begins.

Will my student have a lot of homework in the 6th Grade?

You may not see much homework coming home during 6th grade. We have 5 periods a day, so each period is 55-60 minutes long. The 6th grade teachers design their instruction to allow for time for assignments to be started and/or completed in the classroom. Students can also stay for Bonus in order to get homework completed.

When will my student get the North Montgomery Student Handbook?

Your student's NMMS Handbook will be electronically distributed a few days after receiving their 1:1 device. Please make sure you and your student read through the Student Handbook that will be included on the device. Students will not receive a hard copy of the Student Handbook however will be required to sign the Student Handbook form stating they received and reviewed the procedures of North Montgomery Middle School. This form will be on file in the main office.

When will my student eat lunch?

Your student will be scheduled to eat lunch during his/her 3rd Period class. The 3rd period teacher will tell your child what lunch he/she will be assigned on the first day of school.

How does the cafe work?

**At this time, students will have assigned seats at lunch.

Students are required to keep money in their lunch account. If they run out of money, they will have to eat peanut butter and jelly until the account is paid. Students do not have assigned seating in the café and are allowed to use their 1:1 devices and/or cell phones (just no phone calls).

Will my student have his/her own locker at NMMS?

***At this time, there will be no lockers available to students. This will be reevaluated.*

Yes. Students are assigned their own locker at NMMS. They are not allowed to share lockers during the year. Also, it is important to remember not to share locker combinations with anyone. FYI: Many students enjoy decorating their lockers. Please don't use tape, glue, or stickers of any kind. Magnets are a student's best option.

Where and when will my student get textbooks/1:1 devices?

Textbooks and devices will be passed out by the teachers within the first week of school.

Textbook invoices will be mailed out August 28, 2020 and will be due back September 28, 2020.

What school supplies are needed?

Supply lists are available online at North Montgomery Middle School Website and here tonight.

Are there Wellness (PE) uniforms?

Yes. Students are expected to participate in PE in the designated North Montgomery PE uniform. Uniforms are sold at Top Line in Crawfordsville.

What is the dress code?

North Montgomery's dress code is outlined specifically in the Student Handbook your student will receive electronically during the first few days of school. However, a brief description follows:

- ❖ All tops must have sleeves **or** sufficiently-wide straps and enough fabric to cover chest, shoulders, and underarm areas and not expose undergarments.
- ❖ All shirts must be long enough to be able to be tucked in
- ❖ Halter tops, backless tops, bare midriffs, see-through apparel, fish net garments, excessively short skirts, dresses, or shorts **SHOULD NOT** be worn.
- ❖ No **inappropriate** holes/frays in any clothing.
- ❖ All pants must be worn so that no undergarments are exposed.
- ❖ Shorts, dresses, and skirts (including slits) should be at a reasonable length (walking shorts) with modern styles taken into consideration. Spandex shorts follow the same procedures as mentioned above.
- ❖ Clothing displaying writing that promotes violence, denotes membership in a gang, bears racially or sexually offensive messages, has a double meaning, innuendo, or other reference to inappropriate ideas, advertises, promotes, or glorifies the use of alcohol, tobacco, drugs, or other illegal substances **SHOULD NOT** be worn.
- ❖ Students **MAY NOT** wear attire that can cause personal injury to them or others or that may damage school property; this type of attire includes chains and items with studs.
- ❖ Hats, caps, bandanas, or other head coverings **shouldn't** be worn (except spirit days).

What happens if my student's clothing does not meet the dress code?

If your student is not dressed appropriately, he/she will be given the opportunity to change into something more appropriate. We may have to contact you if your student does not have anything at school and does not want to wear what we offer them; however, our school nurse has extra clothes in the clinic.

Can my student bring personal electronic devices (smart phones, iPods, etc.) to school?

Students may bring personal computing devices to school **for educational purposes only** such as research, writing, and other educational purposes with individual teacher permission, however all North Montgomery students will be issued a 1:1 school device resulting in students not needing their personal devices.

*NMCS will not be held responsible for lost, stolen or damaged computers, hardware, peripherals or software.

What if my student gets sick during the school day?

Students must see the school nurse if they get sick during the school day. The nurse calls parents if a student needs to go home. If a student shows symptoms of COVID-19, there will be an alternate setting for these children and guardians will be notified.

What if my student needs to use the phone? Can he/she just use a cell phone?

Use of personal cell/smartphone within the classroom is a disruption to the learning environment and **will not** be permitted. Students may go to the office to make personal phone calls. It is advised that parents do not call students' cell phones during the school day. You may call the front office as Mrs. Randall will always find your child to give them a message.

My student wants to ride the bus home with a friend after school. What is the procedure in this situation?

*****At this time, our transportations department has made this option unavailable due to COVID.***

A note from a parent/guardian is needed. Students are not allowed to board a bus that is not their own without a bus pass. Mrs. Randall, the receptionist at the front desk in the office, issues all bus passes. Notes/phone calls from parents giving permission must go through Mrs. Randall and must be in before noon on any given day.

Are there school dances?

*****At this time, there are no school dances scheduled due to COVID***

Yes, school dances occur throughout the school year and are sponsored by either the North Montgomery MS Student Council or the NMMS National Junior Honor Society.

Are there any clubs, activities, or sports?

*****These will participate as much as possible with restrictions***

YES! Here is a list of activities open to 6th graders (including but not limited to):

Football, Basketball, Track, Golf, Tennis, Cheerleading, Student Council, Cross Country, Soccer, Volleyball, Art Club, FACS Club, Robotic Club, FCS, Yearbook Club, etc.

What should I tell my student to do if the locker gets stuck, they forget the combination, or their class schedule?

Encourage your student to go to a teacher or the office for help. Please go over with them how important it is for them to not give out their locker combination to anyone. Students are not allowed to share lockers with other people. All students have been assigned their own locker and need to use the one assigned to them.

How does my student get involved in sports/clubs?

Announcements are read at the beginning of every school day. It is during this time that students will get information regarding sports tryouts and club meetings. Information will also be provided on the school website. You may also call the front office for any questions regarding sports or clubs. Call outs and sign-ups also take place during the three lunch periods.

***Please note:** Students must have a physical and a drug form on file at NMMS before they can participate in any sports activities or other extra-curricular activities.

An older student I know told me the 8th graders stuff the 6th graders into lockers. Is that true?

NO! Although there are 8th graders in the building, they are hardly ever in the same hallway with the 6th graders. They are worried about getting to class on time, just like your student will be. However, just so you know, our hallways are monitored at all times by staff members and security cameras.

What if someone picks on my student?

The best thing you can encourage your child to do is to walk away from the situation. If the situation is more than he/she can handle, report the situation to a staff member (counselor, teacher, principal, etc.). We will take care of the situation and make sure your student is well taken care of. Please encourage your child to come to us; we cannot take care of a situation we know nothing about.
